Before going to work in the mines my husband had been called to go to Vietnam. While he was there he was exposed to Agent Orange. I on the other hand was hurt in the mines and do currently have black lung; also 2 years ago I was diagnosed with Colon Cancer. After being hurt I was unable to go back to work and I now receive Disability.

I pray that you all never go through what you are wanting and are going to put us through. I know this story probably does not mean anything to you, but for this widow woman and her son with his conditions it does. When need our health care without it I don't know what we will do.

To God this does matter and I know because he cares. I speak in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, that our insurance not be taken away or cut back. We are praying that God moves on this situation. I hope and pray you ALL will have a little compassion for us and those in my situation.
