2. The Retention Order requires APS to file monthly staffing reports with the Court with copies to the Notice Parties, as defined in the Retention Order. The staffing report must include the names of the individuals assigned to be members of the Temporary Staff. All staffing is subject to review by the Court in the event an objection is filed.

3. The attached **Exhibit A** includes a list of the members of the Temporary Staff¹ that provided services to the Debtors during this Staffing Period, along with their corresponding function descriptions and APS billing rates.
