

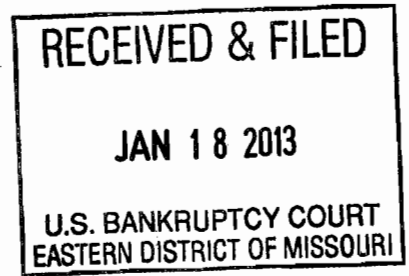

I was disabled in June of 1993 while working for Peabody Coal Co. Eagle #2 mine in Shawneetown, IL. I was only 49 at the time and was declared disabled by 7 doctors after having back surgery. I was young and it was traumatic since I had worked for 23 yrs with an excellent work record.

I never worked for Patriot Coal, I was disably retired under the 1974 Coal Act Plan. I am now 68 and in fear of losing my pension and, most importantly, my insurance for my wife and me.
