

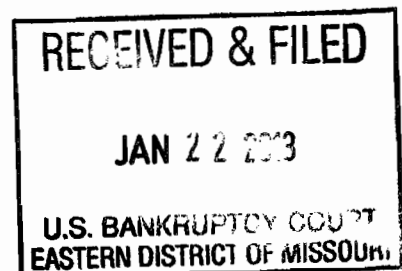

To the Bankruptcy Judge:

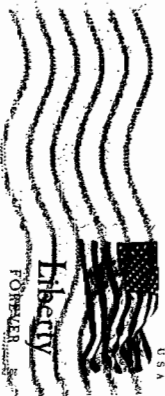
