

You have been approved for continued medical benefits as a surviving spouse, through Peabody Holding Company, Inc.



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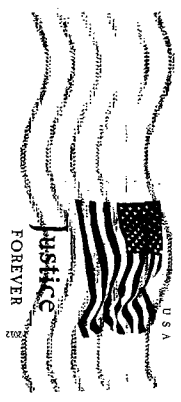
