
Although I never worked for Patriot Coal Co., my healthcare is now administered by them. This was a result of Peabody creating Patriot in 2007 just to relieve themselves of certain financial obligations. As Patriot flounders, Peabody continues to prosper and should be made to honor their obligations to those who sacrificed themselves.

On different occasions the government created avenues to secure health benefits for the coal miners during their retirement years. Agreements such as the Krug-Lewis Agreement, the 1992 Coal Act, as well as other bills passed by our government guaranteed these rights.
