el am a retired Coal Winer from Arch Coal Company in which was handed down to Patriot Coal, el worked 27 years underground as a Coal miner and had worked 11 years before that in a machine shop.

Coal Mining for me was a way of Life that I enjoyed, hardwork, but a decent living for me and my family. A job with security with apension and insurance after my retirement, who could ask for more of worked hard and gave my all for a days wages and a promise that one day it would be worth it all, I could retire with pension and insurance.

My retirement Came a little earlier than I had planned, white at work underground for Arch Coal there was a slate fall, the top was falling in on the piece of equipment I was on top of, I jumped to get out of the way of the rock that was falling and when I landed I busted my disc's in my back, I got out of the mines with help, and after seeing a doctor he announced that after test, exay and M.RI. that I could no longer work that the damage I suffered was to bad for me to Continue working. So I retired with a disabled mines pension at 55 years old. But the fall left me not able to stand for near long, and I fall sometimes when walking and have torned muscles in my shoulders from trying to Cotch myself when I fall. Since my retirement I have had both shoulders repaired for the torn

muscles and have had a heart attack with blocked arteries and had surgrey for that, I am on 7 precription medicines that would be impossible to buy without chrowance, the cost for the surgeries and medicine would be to much for anyone to pay. As the cost of everything seems to shyrochet all elbane to line on is my pension and social security and my chrowance is invaluable to me and my wife as we are both getting alder, I am 67 years old and my wife will soon be 62 years of age. My wife Patricia works part time at a department store to help with income, the only insurance she has is through Patriot Coal.

Medicare does pay some of my medical hills but not all, Hospitals and some doctors don't like medicare alone because it doesn't pay much of the hill my Patriot chrowance pays the rest. elf I had to pay what medicare doesn't pay my fear is that I would love my home. as time goes by my health is not very good. I have more and more frequent risits to the doctor for different reasons. My Pension and Insurance sustains us it would be unthinkable and devastating to lose either of them.

What I have left to enjoy in this life is my home & family and our dignity benowing that we gave our very best for adays wages year after year and all I want in return is for the promise made to me to stand

to stand now that I can no longer provide for me and my family.

I gave my very best I had with hardnesonk, dedication to my
job, I would like to beep my home and live without worry of
losing it and everything I worked for.
