

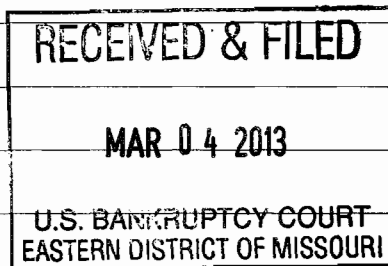
Dear Hon. Kathy A Garratt - Stales
