

Your Honorable Kathy A. Surratt-States

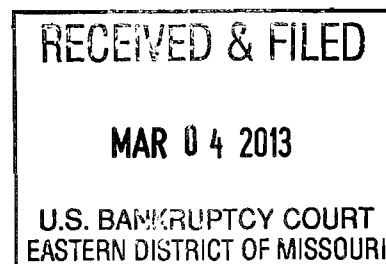

Without the UMWA we could not have survived, especially the two operations he had to have. He died in 1992 of a heart attack. I have since moved to Cheyenne, Wy. to be close to my daughter. I receive a small check from Peabody but most important is the medical card that pays for everything after Medicare. I only have to pay a \$5.00 co-pay for doctors, and all diagnostics are paid for. I am 76 yrs. old now and I worked until I was 67 but I cannot work anymore. I am very grateful for my Medical card and I do not know what I would do without it. I thought that I would have this card for the rest of my life. I hope you can help the UMWA with this case. I know that everyone who has worked for Peabody will be grateful.

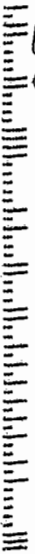
