PROCEEDINGS
THE CLERK: Please rise. The United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Missouri is now in session, the Honorable Kathy A. Surratt-States presiding.

THE COURT: Good morning. Please be seated.
All right, this is in the Patriot Coal matter. Let me get appearances in the courtroom first.

MR. WALSH: Good morning, Your Honor. Brian Walsh and Laura Hughes on behalf of the reorganized debtors and also on behalf of Bryan Cave in connection with its final fee application.

THE COURT: All right. Good morning.
MR. WALSH: Good morning.

MR. WILLARD: Good morning, Your Honor. May it please the Court. Greg Willard on behalf of the creditors' committee and Carmody MacDonald for its final fee application.

THE COURT: All right. Good morning, Mr. Willard.
All right, and then on the phone we have Mr. Huebner and
Ms. McGreal on behalf of the reorganized debtors?
MR. HUEBNER: Good morning, Your Honor. We miss you.
THE COURT: Good morning. I miss seeing you, too,

Mr. Huebner.

MR. HUEBNER: Well, I'm not getting any better-looking.
You're not missing anything.
THE COURT: All right.

All right, and then we have Mr. Eastlake on behalf of Greenberg Traurig?

MR. EASTLAKE: Yes. Good morning, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Good morning.
And we have Turner Smith on behalf of Curtis Mallet?

MR. SMITH: Yes, Your Honor. Good morning.

THE COURT: Good morning.
And Mr. Plotko and Mr. Blank on behalf of the creditors' committee?

MR. PLOTKO: Yes, Your Honor. We're also here with Bradley O'Neill from our firm. Good morning.

THE COURT: Oh, all right.
Good morning, Mr. O'Neill.
And then we have Mr. Mazzuchi on behalf of Houlihan Lokey?

MR. MAZZUCHI: Yes. Good morning, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Good morning.
And Mr. Kehl on behalf of Mesirow?

MR. KEHL: Good morning, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Good morning.
And Mr. Peterson on behalf of Ernst \& Young?
MR. PETERSON: Good morning, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Good morning.
All right. Mr. Walsh, should we take up the claim objections first and then the fee apps? Because I think most
of the claim objections are unopposed, as well.

MS. HUGHES: That's right. Thanks, Your Honor. Laura Hughes for the reorganized debtors.

On the claim-objections issues, yes, they are very short and sweet this morning.

THE COURT: All right.

MS. HUGHES: On the twenty-eighth omnibus objection to claims, which is asbestos claims that were insufficiently documented, we have received no object -- I'm sorry -- no responses to our objection. The grounds for the objection was that the claims were garden-variety asbestos litigation filed by plaintiffs who worked for companies that were perhaps related to the debtors at some point --

THE COURT: All right.
MS. HUGHES: -- filed in Madison County. No claims against Patriot were identified, and nothing in the proofs of claim provides any evidence to support that there should be any claim against the debtors. And so we request that the Court just disallow those claims.

THE COURT: All right, then I'll sustain the objection and those claims will be disallowed.

MS. HUGHES: Thank you.
THE COURT: Thank you.
MS. HUGHES: On the twenty-ninth omnibus objection, which is the Black Lung Benefit Act claims, there the underlying
claims are not requested to be disallowed but, rather, just sort of taken care of through plan language. It is -- the debtors in this case have been handling the Black Lung claims in the ordinary course of business since the inception of the cases, and the claims are not discharged under the plan. So -however, there's no need for additional claims against the estates because they're being taken care of by the reorganized debtors.

THE COURT: All right.

MS. HUGHES: So there we would ask for the Court to sustain the objection.

THE COURT: All right, then $I$ will sustain that objection as well.

MS. HUGHES: The thirtieth omnibus objection to claims is employment-related books-and-records objections. Here the uniting factor is that all of the claimants are employees or former employees and that they are sort of employment-related issues, such as claims related to benefits issues, the termination of programs like the medical premium reimbursement program, in addition to, sort of, the books-and-records objections, that they were duplicative, for example.

We received no objections to any of these claims objections, and so we would request that the Court modify or disallow the claims as requested in the objection.

THE COURT: All right, then I'll sustain that objection
as well.

MS. HUGHES: Thank you.
THE COURT: Thank you.
MS. HUGHES: And then as to the thirty-first omnibus objection to claims, which is books-and-records claims, these are the same books-and-records claims that have been coming up throughout the case. Here they are nonemployee creditors but sort of the same ones that you have been hearing all along.

Again, we received no responses to the objection, and so we would request that the Court disallow or modify the claims as requested in the objection.

THE COURT: All right, then I'll sustain the objection.
MS. HUGHES: Thank you.
THE COURT: Thank you.

MS. HUGHES: And then the last one is a single-creditor objection directed to Bridgestone Americas Tire Operations, LLC. There we resolved the objection yesterday with the creditor and, so, have a revised proposed order that we have come to an agreement on, and we'll submit that to the Court. THE COURT: All right, then I'll mark that settled and I'll look for that proposed order, then.

MS. HUGHES: Thank you.
THE COURT: Thank you. All right, then that takes care of all of that.

Then that brings us, then, to the fee applications.

Mr. Walsh?

MR. WALSH: Yes, Your Honor. We can take these up in any order the Court would like. We put them on our agenda in docket filing order. We can take them in alphabetical order or whatever --

THE COURT: Alphabet --

MR. WALSH: -- whatever's your desire.
THE COURT: Alphabetical probably works better for me under these circumstances.

MR. WALSH: All right. Very good, Your Honor. I do not have a list, myself, in alphabetical order. I don't know if you --

THE COURT: Oh, all right, then I'll -- okay, so first would be Blackstone. And before we take up the fee applications, of course, in my review of the fee applications I always like to say that $I$ recognize that there were many tasks that have been completed in this case rather successfully, but we should always be mindful of being good stewards of the time and expenses charged, as professionals in this case. I certainly appreciate everyone's efforts to keep their fees and expenses reasonable under the circumstances. I may make a few reductions based on my review of the fee applications and request some additional documentation; but as we go through each individual fee application, I'll let you know.

So, Mr. Walsh, the first one I have would be Blackstone

Advisory's, as the financial advisors to the debtors.
MR. WALSH: Yes, Your Honor. There have been no filed objections as to any of the final fee applications, and we are not aware of any issues that have been raised by any parties. But I know the Court, as you mentioned, at times has had certain comments.

THE COURT: Correct. And on Blackstone's fee application, $I$ would make a reduction for charges of car services of $\$ 5,841.29$, and that would be my only reduction. Then $I$ would approve the fees and costs, then, in the remaining amounts requested.

MR. WALSH: Very good, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Thank you. All right, the next would be Bowles Rice, who is special counsel to the debtors.

MR. WALSH: Yes, Your Honor. And similarly, we're aware of no responses or formal or informal objections to that.

THE COURT: All right. And the Court having seen that, and I have reviewed that fee application, I will approve that application in the amounts requested.

Then next, Mr. Walsh, would be Bryan Cave as local counsel to the debtors.

MR. WALSH: Yes, Your Honor. Your Honor had made some reductions in connection with our second interim application, and we've reflected those in the request. Our totals in our application include everything. Our request for compensation
makes the reductions that were previously made in that second round, Your Honor.

THE COURT: All right. And I would only make one additional deduction. There was a lunch on August the 10th, of $\$ 108.85$, so $I$ would reduce the expenses by that amount and then approve the application in the remaining amounts requested.

MR. WALSH: Very good, Your Honor. Thank you.
THE COURT: All right. Thank you. Next is Carmody

MacDonald as local counsel to the creditors' committee.
Mr. Willard?
MR. WILLARD: Good morning, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Good morning.
MR. WILLARD: Similarly, no objections have been filed to our fee application. I would also represent to the Court that I reached out to Ms. Long at the United States Trustee's office just to make certain that they didn't have any questions or concerns with our application, and Ms. Long expressed none. So the matter may be taken as submitted.

THE COURT: All right. And I have reviewed the application as well, and I will approve the application in the amounts requested.

MR. WILLARD: Thank you, Your Honor.
THE COURT: Thank you.
Next would be Cole Schotz, who's creditors' committee's conflicts counsel. I have reviewed that fee application and I

will approve the application in the amounts requested.
All right, then next on my list would be Curtis MalletPrevost, Debtors' conflicts counsel. And I have approved -- I have reviewed that application and will approve it in the amounts requested.

Then next would be Davis Polk, Debtors' counsel.
Mr. Huebner, I'll make the following reductions: meals of \$4,872.65, and a miscellaneous charge of -- I think \$491.51. And then I would request detail on the travel for the entire period, and a charge of court and other fees in September, of \$12,768.40. And then after I review that, I would make a final determination. I'm sure there's ample detail for that; I just need to review it.

MR. HUEBNER: Sure. Your Honor, we'll absolutely provide it. I think that for the first three fee periods, I think we had already provided the further backup of the travel. When you say "the entire period", do you mean the last quarterly one which the Court is now being (sic) reviewed --

THE COURT: Yes.
MR. HUEBNER: -- or do you mean the entire case?

THE COURT: No, I mean the last -- don't give me all that paper. I mean, yes, for the period requested.

MR. HUEBNER: Perfect. Understood. So we'll go through the last quarter and provide the backup detail for the travel, and we'll look into those other charges. I think they are
probably PACER charges and court-reporter fees.

THE COURT: Okay.
MR. HUEBNER: They're third-party vendors. But we will of course supply chambers with all the detail.

THE COURT: All right. Thank you.
All right, then next is Desai Eggmann Mason. I will approve that application in the amounts requested.

Then next is Duff --
MS. MCGREAL: Sorry, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Yes.

MS. MCGREAL: Michelle McGreal of Davis Polk \& Wardwell, on behalf of the reorganized debtors.

THE COURT: Yes.

MS. MCGREAL: On the Desai Eggmann application --
THE COURT: Yes.

MS. MCGREAL: -- Mr. Riske of Desai Eggmann has actually authorized me to speak on his behalf. The parties have agreed to reduce the fees and expenses that Desai Eggmann has requested, to $\$ 939.01$, and that's in accordance with Your Honor's order that authorized the appointment of the nonunion retiree committee. There was actually a cap there --

THE COURT: Oh, right.
MS. MCGREAL: -- for 310,000 dollars on the fees and expenses of that committee. And so the 939.01 will bring us up to that cap. Anything over that would be over the cap.

So Mr. Riske has agreed to that, and the revised order will reflect that.

THE COURT: Oh, all right. Thank you, Ms. McGreal.
MS . MCGREAL: Yep.
THE COURT: All right, then next is Duff Phelps. I'll make the following reductions: for transportation between New Jersey and Philadelphia, of \$250.32; late-night transportation from office to home, of $\$ 155$; and reduce by half the cost of processing the fee application, of $\$ 3,799.60$ for a total reduction of \$4,049.92.

All right, next is Epiq Bankruptcy Solutions. I'll approve their application in the amounts requested.

Ernst \& Young --

Who's on -- somebody's on the phone for --
Mr. Peterson, I'll make a reduction of $\$ 168.20$ for dinner on July 15th for three people, and then approve the application, then, in the remaining amounts requested.

MR. PETERSON: Did you say July 15th, Your Honor?
THE COURT: Yes.

MR. PETERSON: Was that from the third interim period or is that --

THE COURT: Well, I don't recall. It was in what I reviewed.

MR. PETERSON: Very well. Thank you.
THE COURT: All right. Thank you.

All right, next is GCG, Inc. I'll approve the application in the amounts requested.

GCP Legal Advisors: I'll approve that application in the amounts requested.

Gordon \& Gordon, who is special counsel to the debtors: I'll approve the application in the amounts requested.

Greenberg Traurig, who is special counsel to the debtors:
I'll approve the application in the amounts requested.
Houlihan Lokey: I will make one reduction of $\$ 79.52$ in meals for one day, for one person, on August the 7 th , and then I'll approve the application, then, in the remaining amounts requested.

Jackson Kelly, special counsel to the debtors: I will approve their application in the amounts requested.

Kramer Levin, creditors' committee counsel: I will make one reduction in Westlaw charges in September, of $\$ 8,517.44$, and then I'll approve the application in the remaining amounts requested.

Mesirow Financial Consulting: I will make a reduction for a miscellaneous charge of $\$ 517.16$ in October, and then approve the application in the remaining amounts requested.

Ogletree Deakins, special counsel to the debtor: I will approve the application in the amounts requested.

Stahl Cowen, counsel to the salaried retiree committee:
I'll approve their application in the amounts requested.

Thompson Coburn, special counsel to the debtors: I am looking for detail for the expenses of $\$ 12,005.20$ for consulting in London, within seven days, if that could be provided directly to chambers.

Then there's Veritas Consulting. I'll approve their application in the amounts requested.

And then finally, AP Services, LLC: I will approve their application in the amounts requested.

So once I have completed my additional review, I will be in contact with Davis Polk for a revised proposed order and have that entered.

All right, Mr. Walsh, anything else, then, this morning on behalf of the reorganized debtors?

MR. WALSH: No, there's not, Your Honor. Thank you.
THE COURT: All right.
Mr. Huebner or Ms. McGreal, anything else?
MR. HUEBNER: Your Honor, we're great. Thank you. I think we gave our thank-you speeches at the confirmation hearing, so $I$ won't repeat them. But I would note that Patriot is swimming along and hasn't gotten into any new trouble yet.

THE COURT: Good. I'm glad to hear that.
All right, then, Mr. Willard, anything else on behalf of the creditors' committee this morning?

MR. WILLARD: No, Your Honor. I didn't say anything at the last hearing, but if $I$ could take a moment to make two comments; one is to echo the comments that have been previously made to the Court and the court staff and the clerk's staff. I've been at this podium, figuratively, for a long time, and hope to continue for a little bit longer. But it was -- it's a real pleasure, as a member of the bar of this Court for so many years, to participate in a case that is as successful as this one has been. And hopefully the trouble that Mr. Huebner just referenced will not happen.

And finally, Your Honor, I would be remiss if I did not make another observation, and that is about my co-counsel at Kramer Levin. I referenced it in the Carmody MacDonald fee app, but $I$ think it bears repeating here today on the record. This was a big case that required a lot of horsepower, if you will, particularly at the committee level. We had a lot of difficult issues. And Your Honor will remember the makeup of our committee; it certainly was not homogenous.

And with Mr. O'Neill and Plotko and Blank, and then of course Mr. Mayer, they were the captains of the ship. But in a, I think, very noticeable way, they were also, to use your phrase, Your Honor, good stewards of estate assets, in terms of how they staffed the case, how they staffed courtroom hearings, how they staffed matters that required travel time. And I would hope that all of us, as members of the bar on this side
of the podium, in the years ahead will remember that and the model that I think they established, because I think it was exemplary and at the highest standards certainly of my colleagues and $I$, who are members of the bar of this Court. And I wanted to publicly commend them at this, the final hearing. Thank you, Your Honor.

THE COURT: All right. Thank you, Mr. Willard.
All right, then on the phone, anything else, Mr. Plotko, Mr. Blank or Mr. O'Neill?

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No. Thank you very much, Your
Honor. We're very pleased with the results in the case, and we really enjoyed our stay in St. Louis.

THE COURT: All right.
UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We hope to be there again
sometime.

THE COURT: All right. We certainly enjoyed having you all here, as well.

All right, then any other requests by any of the other parties on the phone?

All right, then hearing none, we'll be in recess. Thank you.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you, Judge.
THE COURT: Thank you.

If no Statement of Transcript Redactions is filed within the allotted time, the Court will presume redaction of personal identifiers is not necessary.

Any party may file a response in opposition to the Statement within 7 days of the date the Statement is filed using the Response to Statement of Transcript Redactions event. If a response in opposition to the Statement is filed, the Court will rule on the matter. If a hearing is needed, the Court will send notice of hearing.

If a request for redaction is filed, the redacted transcript is due within 31 days of the date of this notice: April 28, 2014.

The transcript may be made available for remote electronic access upon expiration of the restriction period, which is 90 days from the date of filing of the transcript: June 25, 2014, unless extended by court order. However, during this 90 -day period the transcript is available for viewing only during normal business hours at the Clerk's office.
