## ORDER SUSTAINING REORGANIZED DEBTORS' THIRTY-THIRD OMNIBUS OBJECTION TO CLAIMS (Books and Records)

(GCG Claim Nos. 4228 and 4230). The hearing on the Objection to such Claims is hereby continued to June 24, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. in Courtroom 7-North.

3. The Clerk of the Court and the Reorganized Debtors' claims agent are hereby directed to reflect the disallowance and/or modification of the Insufficiently Documented Claim, as specified above, in their respective records.
