I am a 73 year old man that spent 27 good years working for Peabody River Queen mines. At the age of 51 I was forced to retire because of a very serious heart condition. I couldn't count the times I have been at death door in the ICU. I have had major heart surgery which left me with a severe damaged heart. I have had to have ballons and stints put in several times. But I thank God for the great insurance that I have. I am on several different medicines that I have to have to survive, which includes high doses of blood thinners. It is very, very important that I get my blood level tested regularly every week or so, to make sure the blood level is kept at a certain number. If I lost my insurance, there is no way I could afford the lab work, much less all the medical care that I need. It does not take very long for a blood clot to kill someone. I pray I get a few more good years, but I need my medical insurance to survive. Without our medical card, we would lose what we have worked so hard to have to live on at this stage in our lds
