We have worked years, I did 28 years, and I received in return black lung. I have 60% black lung, so I breathed alot of dust while I was working in the underground mines 19 years, and 9 years in strip mines.

It was negotiated, we would have a miners medical card for me and my family until we die. Now Patriot is trying to wiggle out of the agreement.

Please! Judge Chapman, help us Miners and hear our side of the petition to keep our cards, so we can get the medical cards as promised.

Alot of us miners are older members with medical problems - a survivor from the mine dust and other illnesses we may have.

There were several times while I was working, we had to scaddle

out of the line of danger where the roof was falling in on us. But by God's grace, us men made it out ok.

Please don't rush into an agreement for Patriot, but consider us miners who went underground or strip mines, and knew the dangers and unsuspected accidents that occur and did occur while I was working in both underground and strip mines.

Please help us miners and families in this urgent time of need.

Thank you for reading my letter. I hope you did get to read it your Honor.
